

Stuart J. Brink, MD

Professor Brink is the Senior Pediatric Endocrinologist at NEDEC, New England Diabetes and Endocrinology Center, in Waltham, Massachusetts, USA. He is an Associate Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at Tufts University School of Medicine and a Clinical Instructor in Pediatrics at Harvard Medical School as well. He is a Past-President of ISPAD (the International Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Diabetes) and has been ISPAD's Secretary-General twice in the past as well as ISPAD's current International Education Liaison Chair with current projects ongoing in Krasnoyarsk, Russia, Timisoara, Romania and sub-Saharan Africa. He has lectured in more than 40 countries around the world. He's edited 3 pediatric and adolescent diabetes textbooks, written and edited a new pediatric diabetes textbook for developing countries and co-edited 2 other pediatric endocrinology textbooks.

Dr Brink and his staff provide consultative care for pediatric, adolescent and young adult diabetes and endocrine problems. He has served on the National Board of Directors of the American Diabetes Association as well as been the ADA's National Chair for the Council on Diabetes and Youth. He was a co-investigator of the NIH-sponsored DCCT for ten years and also served on the American Academy of Pediatrics Endocrine Executive Committee and on the International Diabetes Federation's Youth Section Consultative Section as well as its current Youth Task Force. In addition to the AAP, ADA, ISPAD and IDF, he is a professional member of the American Association of Clinical Endocrinologist (AACE), the Lawson Wilkins Pediatric Endocrine Society (LWPES) and the Endocrine Society and is ISPAD representative on the Steering Committee of GPED, Global Pediatric Endocrine and Diabetes consortium.

Dr Brink has been awarded a Doctor Honoris Causa from the University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Timisoara, Romania as well as the ADA's Outstanding Contribution to Diabetes in Youth award and the JDF's Anne Woolf award and is recognized as one of the Best Doctors in America as well as numerous Who's Who publications and the Guide to America's Top Pediatricians. He was ISPAD's prestigious Lestradet Award winner in 2011 for international contributions for diabetes education and advocacy.
